INTERNAL DESCRIPTION

fol. Ir: dedication to a Spanish envoy by a later hand, repeated at fol. 190r, followed by barely legible words and the date 1570;

fol. Iv: three sixteenth-century notes of possession;

fol. 1r-7r: alphabetical index of the first lines of *RVF* poems (under each letter of the alphabet, poems are listed in order of appearance and accompanied by the specification 'post mortem');

fol. 7v: blank;

fol. 8r-10r: scattered letters;

fol. 10v: decorated coloured *tondo* inscribed in a double laurel frame containing the title of the ms.: 'IN QUESTO ORNATISSIMO LIBRO SE CONTENGANO LI SONETTI CANZONE ET TRIVMPHI DEL PRESTANTISSIMO POETA MESSER FRANCESCO PETRARCA';

fol. 11r-108r: *RVF* 1-263 with the additional *dispersa* 'Donna mi uiene spesso ne la mente' at fol. 35v ('INCOMINCIANO LI SONETTI ET CANZONE DE LO ELEGANTISSIMO POETA MES[SER] FRANCESCO PETRARCA');

fol. 108r-149v: *RVF* 264-366;

fol. 150r-150v: scattered letters;

fol. 151r-187r: *Triumphs* (order: *Amoris I, Amoris III, Amoris IV, Amoris II, Pudicitie, Mortis Ia, Mortis I, Mortis II, Fame Ia, Fame I, Fame II, Fame III.1-99, Temporis 7-126, Eternitatis 7-145*);

fol. 187r: inscription with the name of the copyist: 'MANV MATTHÀEI DOMINI HERCVLANI DE VVLERRIS';

fol. 187v: blank;

fol. 188r: Petrarch's note on Laura (<inc> LAurea [sic] proprijs uirtutibus illustris, & meis longum celebrata carminibus; <exp> in expectatos exitus acriter ac uiriliter cogitanti);

followed by an extract from Petrarch's Latin letter to Giacomo Colonna (*Fam.* II.9) (<inc> QUID ergo ais finxisse me mihi speciosum Laur[a]e nomen; <exp> Tibi pallor; tibi labor meus notue est. VALE);

fol. 188v-189v: blank;

Other contents:

fol. 190r: one sonnet by anonymous author ('Ilustri legato hispano comes bertholomeus chalipius congratulat[ur] de uictoria hispanioru[m] contra gallos'; <inc> hispanus ferus hinc, illinc quoque gallicus hostis).

NOTES

Fols. 11r and 151r have a rich architectural frame with floral decorations, medallions, small animals and cupids; at the bottom of fol. 11r is a coat of arms of the Spanish families Figueroa, Mendoza, and Enríquez, which presumably substituted the original coat of arms of the Montefeltro family. A similar architectural frame was designed for each *Triumphus* as testified by the architectural frame in pen, clearly unfinished, for *Triumphus Pudicitie* at fol. 162v. *Triumphus Amoris, Pudicitie, Mortis, Fame* are decorated with rectangular-box illumination representing the corresponding *Triumphus* (fols. 151r, 162v, 166v, 176r). Historiated initial for *RVF* 1, representing Petrarch holding a book; decorated initials in gold for each *RVF* poem, each *Triumphus*, and each subsequent *capitolo*. The ms. was penned by amanuensis Matteo di Ercolano Contugi (or Matteo di Volterra).

Missing lines of *Fame* III, *Temporis*, and *Eternitatis* due to the loss of fols.
