Vna uentosa gloria mi parbe [sic] sempre del solo splendore dele parole cercar fama. Queste cose dise stesso francesco petrarcha alla posterita a referite elquale diche ingegno fusse lopere sue eldemostrano che danoi fedelmente interpetrate [sic] sono);

fol. 126r-126v: second part of the alphabetical index of the first lines of *RVF* poems (under each letter of the alphabet [S-Z], poems are listed in order of appearance);

fols. 126v: Petrarch's *dispersa*, 'Aj lingua ay penna mia che in tante carte', and [Niccolò Tinucci's] sonnet 'Ben puoi leladre luci aterra sparte';

fol. 127r: Petrarch's note on Laura (<inc> Laurea [sic] proprijs uirtutibus illustris & meis longum celebrata carminibus; <exp> in expectatos exitus acriter ac uiriliter cogitanti);

fol. 127r: colophon: Finito elibro chiamato petrarca nelquale sono ccc<sup>c</sup>xviiij<sup>o</sup> sonetti & xxviiij<sup>o</sup> cançoni morali & .x. madriali & viij<sup>o</sup> sestine & sei triumphi cio e xij Capitoli intutto ccc<sup>c</sup>lxxviiij<sup>o</sup>. scripto dimano dime franceso [sic] digoro massainj dasiena. ### **NOTES**

Occasional marginal annotations by the same hand either add a few missing words, or write a running number close to each *capitolo* of the *Triumphi*, or else invite the readers to learn a passage by heart (e.g., by writing 'memoria').

After fol. 41, a fol. (with RVF 135.58-97-138) is missing.

Historiated initials for RVF 267 showing the head of Laura (fol. 68r) and RVF 366 showing the Virgin Mary and Child (fol. 92r); decorated initials in gold for RVF 1 (fol. 1r), the beginning of each *Triumphus* and each subsequent *capitolo*, and life of Petrarch (fols. 122r and 123v); decorated initials for every RVF poem, Petrarch's *dispersa*, Tinucci's sonnet, and Petrarch's note on Laura.
