Other contents:

fols. 97r-160v: several poems (mainly sonnets, but also *canzoni* and *capitoli*) by many authors (including Dante, Pseudo-Dante, Antonio da Ferrara, Simone Serdini da Siena, Jacopo Sanguinacci, Giusto de' Conti). For a detailed list of first lines and authors, see Zamponi 1984, 58-61;

fols. 164v-178r: several poems (mainly sonnets, but also some *canzoni*) by Fazio degli Uberti and Giovanni Antonio Romanello. For a detailed list of first lines, see Zamponi 1984, 61-63;

fol. 178r: colophon: *Vulgarium finale seu expedition totius opusculi. Felicitas augusta;*

fol. 178v: sonnet 'Gloria q[on]forto [sic] eben senza misura' by a later hand; this fol. is followed by two unnumbered fols.;

fol. 179r: scattered words by a later hand followed by RVF 246 by a different humanistic hand;

fol. 179v: a motto ('*Respice finem. HVMI*') followed by Francesco Philippi de' Ancona's sonnet 'Da qual angel gentil natura tolse' by a later hand; inner-part of end board: Francesco Philippi de' Ancona's sonnet 'Lassiato hacypri suo lalma Cupido'.

NOTES

Decorated initials for the beginning of each *Triumphus* and each subsequent *capitolo*, RVF 360, 105, 323, 50, 331, 119, Pseudo-Petrarch's poem in *terza rima* 'Una donna che più legiadra in terra', and many other poems listed in the 'other contents' section of the internal description; at the top of fol. 17v is an architectural frame; at the bottom of the same fol. is the coat of arms of the Feliciano family; some *maniculae*.

Fols. 1 and 15-16 are missing.

At fols. 5v-6r, many lines have been erased by a later hand; at fol. 8r, there is a sonnet by a later

hand ('Gloria conforto e bene senza missura'); at fol. 8v, some scattered words by a later hand; and at fol. 13v, seven lines by a later hand.
