### **NOTES**

This ms. was written by Hippolytus Lunensis for Alfonso of Aragon Duke of Calabria. After fol. 144, a letter (in parchment) by Ferdinand I, sent to the Republic of Siena (in which the king announces the birth of his first son Alfonso) has been bound in the ms. as fol. 145.

Decorated initial for *RVF* 1 (fol. 8r); at fol. 8r is an architectural frame.

According to Paolino (1999, 155), this ms. is one of the six manuscript copies of Patrizi's commentary to *RVF*. The other copies are: London, National Art Library (V&A Museum), Forster 48.D.28; Rome, Biblioteca Casanatense, ms. 50; Paris, Bibliothèque nationale de France, italien 1024 and italien 1026; Florence, Biblioteca Riccardiana, Ricc. 1141. There is also another ms. containing Patrizi's commentary: Vatican City, Biblioteca Apostolica Vaticana, Barb. Lat. 3937.
