NOTES

Historiated initial for *RVF* 1 (fol. 1r); decorated initials for *RVF* 264 (fol. 101v), every first *capitolo* of each *Triumphus* (fols. 144r, 156v, 160r, 169v, 176v, 179r), and Sicco’s life of Petrarch (fol. 182r); at fol. 1r is an architectural frame (with geometrical decorations and two medallions [one with the portrait of Laura, on the right side; and one with a book sealed with a chain, at the bottom]).

The anonymous copyist of this ms. transcribed also two other Petrarchan mss.: London, British Library, Harley 3442 and Oxford, Bodleian Library, Canonici Ital. 76 (see Mann 1975, 409).
