fols. 148r-183v: *Triumphi* (order: *Mortis* II, *Fame* Ia, *Amoris* II, *Amoris* I, *Amoris* III, *Amoris* IV, *Pudicitie*, *Mortis* I, *Fame* I, *Fame* II, *Fame* III, *Temporis*, *Eternitatis*);

fol. 183v: colophon: Explicit deo gratias. Qui scrixit scribat semper cum d[omi]no uiuat. Vivat in celis semp[er] cu[m] d[omi]no felix. MEMENTO MEI;

fol. 184r: scattered words, lines, names;

fol. 184v: eight-line satirical composition ‘Sia maledetto alcu[n] ch[e] se diuerta’; in the upper margin: single line ‘Amor piangea et io cu[n] luij tal uolta’.

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NOTES

Fol. 9r has an architectural frame with floral decorations and small animals; at the bottom of the fol. there is an erased coat of arms. Initials in gold for RVF 1, 264 and every *capitolo* of the *Triumphi*; few *maniculae*.

At fol. 184r are various proverbs ('femina nulla bona est: si est bona, no[n] est prefecta [sic], si est p[er]fecta no[n] est probatta [sic']'), partial quotations from literary works ('che [sic] seruir adio conpurita de core uiue contento e saluato more' [Feo Belcari's *laude* 'Chi serve a Dio con purità di core', 1-2]), and two names, possibly indicating notes of possession ('Jo[uanni] Bartolo mio d[i] Jacomo d[i] luesca [sic']; 'Jo[uanni] nicolo uardela').
