NOTES

Annotations are by the same hand that transcribed the text next to the lines of *RVF* and *Triumph*i. The most extensive annotations (at fols. 29r, 52v-53r, 97r, 139r) either deal with mythological and historical figures or relate to events surrounding the composition of the poem (e.g. for *RVF* 120, the copyist recalls the recipient of the sonnet, poet Antonio da Ferrara, who had lamented Petrarch's supposed death); some *maniculae*.
