**NOTES**

British Library copy has a few marginal annotations in Latin. The opening page of the *RVF* is decorated with an unadorned frame in black-ink at the top of the page and two angels at the bottom (one caressing a swan, and the other taking the swan by its neck and putting something in a vase).

John Rylands Library copy has two illuminated coats of arms at fol. 10r (the first one is divided into four quarters: in the first and fourth quarters a rising lion on blue background; in the second and third two red Greek frets on white background; the second coat of arms has a rising lion on golden background; both coats encircled in a laurel crown, close to which there is an angel on each side carrying a cartouche); *RVF* 136-138 fully crossed out by pen both in the alphabetical index and at fols. 61v and 62r.
