fol. 69v: Petrarch's *dispersa* (sonnet 'Poi chal fattor del uniuerso piacque');

fol. 70r-72v: blank;

fol. 73r-90r: *Triumph* (order: *Amoris* I, III.1-85, *Amoris* IV.19-142, *Amoris* III.86-190, *Amoris* IV.1-18, 143-166, *Amoris* II, *Pudicitie*, *Mortis* Ia, *Mortis* I, *Mortis* II, *Fame* Ia, I, *Fame* II, *Fame* III, *Temporis*, *Eternitatis*).

NOTES

This ms. is composed of three different quires, each in a different hand (see Textblock): the second unit is the original core part (late-fourteenth century); the first and the third parts belong to late-fifteenth century and were added before binding together the three sections of the ms. The ms. is significant because of its early composition and its connections with ms. Vat. Lat. 3195. The binding suggests northern Italian confection. A later *mercantesca* added a running header in red ink at the top of each *capitolo* of the *Triumph*.

Fol. 1r has three-quarters richly decorated borders with floral designs; initials in gold for *RVF* (fol. 1r), and the *capitoli* of the *Triumph* (fols. 73r, 74r, 76v, 77r, 78v, 80r, 81v, 83r, 84v, 85v, 87r, 88r, 89r).
