fol. 146r-179v: *Triumph* (order: *Mortis* II, *Fame* Ia, *Amoris* II, *Amoris* I, *Amoris* III, *Amoris* IV, *Pudicitie* (in a shortened and altered version of 100 lines), *Mortis* I, *Fame* I, *Fame* II, *Fame* III, *Temporis*, *Eternitatis*);

fol. 179v: colophon: ET hic finiunt Triu[m]phi petrarce;

fol. 180r-182v: Petrarch's *Penitential Psalms* interrupted after few lines of the fifth one (<inc> Eu [sic] michi misero quia iratum aduersus me constitui redentorem meum et legem suam contumaciter neglexi; <exp> et male michi est somnus meus);

fol. 182v: sonnet by anonymous author penned by a later hand ('Una angelica ydea in facie humana');

fol. 183r: two possession notes introduced by declarations of births in French;

fol. 183v: blank.

NOTES

Rectangular-box illuminations for the second part of *RVF* (fol. 105r) and the beginning of the *Triumph* (fol. 146r). *Triumphus Mortis* II (fol. 146r) has an historiated letter showing a man (presumably Petrarch) addressing a winged figure (probably dead Laura). Decorated initials with floral decorations for *RVF canzoni* and for the *Triumph* (except *Fame* I, showing a fish: fol. 168r). Simpler decorated initials for each *RVF* poems (including initials of each *stanza* of the *canzoni*) and for each *capitolo* of the *Triumph*.

RVF 1-3 are missing due to the loss of a fol. between fols. 8 and 9.
